

Stonesfield Gardening Club Plant Sale – 25 April 2026

Tomatoes

Latah Early Red – Bush

Absurdly early variety for short cold seasons. Tolerates cool summers. 1 – 2inch perfectly spherical red fruit on a wide sprawling bush. Widely spaced leaves for earliest ripening.

Grushovka – Tall Bush

Very, very rare. Plants about 2-3ft, make large egg-shaped deep red tomatoes with a pink skin. Early to fruit, high yielding.

Aurora – Large Bush

Slightly flattened, a beefsteak type with good flavour for cooking. Another excellent early tomato. No need to pinch out but needs stakes for support.

Red Alert – Bush

Early bush variety producing medium-sized red fruits. Suitable for containers.

Tiger Plum – Cordon

Plum variety dazzles with golden-yellow skin streaked with a pinkish-red blush. Bursts with colour and flavour, bringing sunshine to every salad and snack. Each fruit offers a sweet, tropical flavour balanced with citrus notes

Orange Banana – Cordon

An incredibly productive plum type making loads of large orange fruit. Unusual and tasty, a favourite of ours for many years - in both salads and cooking.

Gardener's Delight – Cordon

Prolific cherry tomato with sweet, juicy fruits. Reliable and easy to grow.

Costoluto Fiorentino – Cordon

Traditional Italian variety with ribbed fruits and rich flavour.

San Marzano – Cordon

Classic plum tomato ideal for sauces. Meaty flesh with few seeds.

Roma – Cordon

Popular plum variety for cooking and preserving. Firm, fleshy fruits.

Red Cherry – Cordon

Small, sweet cherry tomatoes borne in clusters. Very productive.

Note: Cordon (indeterminate) tomatoes grow tall as single vines requiring support and regular side-shoot pruning, making them ideal for high-yield greenhouse growing. Bush (determinate) tomatoes are compact, self-supporting, and need no pruning, making them perfect for containers, hanging baskets, and low-maintenance growing.

Peppers

Sweet Pepper – California Wonder Red

Thick-walled red and green sweet peppers. Biggest crops are produced in the greenhouse but also grows well outdoors. Best crops will be achieved in a greenhouse, but smaller, later crops can be produced when grown in a sunny sheltered location outdoors.

Pepper – Biquino Red

An abundance of tear drop-shaped fruit that are only 2cm long and ripen from light green to bright red. With an almost undetectable level of heat, a crunchy texture and a distinctive flavour, they are a treat eaten fresh off the plant. The tidy, bushy plants can be grown unsupported in 2 to 7.5 litre pots. They are late to mature and should be kept undercover throughout the growing season.

Pepper – Trinidad Perfume

Yellow coloured chillis with authentic Habanero flavour, without the heat.

Can be grown outside, so long as they are in a sheltered sunny area, but best results are usually obtained when they are grown in a greenhouse. Delicious when used raw in salads but are also very tasty when cooked.

Pepper – Padrón

A small, mild green Spanish peppers often served as a popular tapas dish, famously known for being a "Russian roulette" snack where an occasional pepper is surprisingly hot. They are best prepared by quickly frying in olive oil until blistered and charred, then topped with coarse sea salt

Pepper – Machu Picchu

Medium-heat chilli producing long, slender fruits. High yielding and suitable for pots.

Pepper – Poupila

Small, colourful ornamental chilli with upright fruits. Decorative and edible with moderate heat.

Pepper – Cayenne

Hot, slim red peppers with strong flavour. Excellent for drying or cooking.

Vegetables

Mangetout Pea - Snow Max

Bushy but semi-leafless, so it has more pods but they are easily visible with an abundant harvest of 3.5" long, flat pods, Plants are resistant to downy mildew, powdery mildew, and Fusarium and are well adapted to all conditions. 80 cm is the maximum height with 25cm spread.

Pea – Early Onward

Early maincrop pea with heavy yields of sweet, tender pods.

Cabbage – Red Rookie

The earliest red cabbage! Ready from mid-August onwards Red Rookie has good holding ability and is resistant to splitting / bolting. Outstanding for quality and flavour. Dense round heads, can also be harvested early as smaller baby heads if space is limited.

Cucumber – Wautoma

A highly disease-resistant, monoecious (producing both male and female flowers) cucumber variety, ideal for pickling or slicing when 4–5 inches long. It produces high yields of bitter-free, dark green, slightly bumpy, and spiny fruits. It is versatile for greenhouse or outdoor cultivation.

Cucumber – Marketmore

Smooth, dark green fruits with excellent flavour. Good disease resistance.

Courgette – Burpees Golden

Compact, early-fruiting producing smooth-skinned, golden-yellow courgettes, which are ready to harvest when approximately 15-20cm (6-8in) in length. These are produced over a long period from July to October. Its relatively compact habit makes it suitable for growing in containers on the patio where border space is limited. The bright yellow flowers can also be picked and used in cooking.

Courgette – Atena

Early, high-yielding variety producing smooth, uniform fruits. Good disease resistance.

Summer Squash – Sunburst

A pretty and tasty pattypan with beautifully sculptured, tender fruits and glossy, butter-yellow skin. Serve steamed to retain their fine, melt-in-the-mouth flavour. Pick small and eat whole as mini-veg.

Squash – Autumn Crown

Butternut-type squash with sweet, nutty flesh. Stores well after harvest.

Lettuce – Tom Thumb

Compact butterhead with small, tightly formed heads. Ideal for containers and small spaces.

Lettuce – Salad Bowl

Loose-leaf variety with tender, deeply cut green leaves. Quick-growing and slow to bolt.

Lettuce – Red Salad Bowl

Attractive red loose-leaf type with oak-shaped leaves. Mild flavour and cut-and-come-again.

Climbing French Bean – Cosse Violette

Purple pods that turn green when cooked. Vigorous climber with good yields.

Climbing French Bean – Lazy Housewife

Stringless green pods, tender and flavourful. Heavy cropping and reliable.

Melon – Cantaloupe

Sweet, aromatic fruit with orange flesh. Best grown in warm, sheltered conditions.

Vegetables

Aubergine – Pinstripe

Striped purple fruits with tender flesh. Compact plants suitable for containers.

Aubergine – Black Beauty

Classic large, glossy purple fruits. High yielding in warm conditions.

Aubergine – Moneymaker

Reliable variety producing medium-sized dark fruits.

Leek – Musselburgh

Hardy winter leek with thick white stems and good flavour.

Sweetcorn – Mini Pop

Produces small cobs ideal for popping. Easy to grow novelty variety.

Sweetcorn – Goldcrest

Early maturing supersweet variety with tender, golden kernels.

Cauliflower – Snowball

Reliable variety producing large, white, tightly packed heads. Good for early crops.

Achocha

A half-hardy climber in the cucumber family, with clinging tendrils - it covers a large area rapidly so is great as an ornamental as well as for its fruits which taste like a mixture of cucumber and green pepper.

Herbs

Coriander

Fast-growing herb with aromatic leaves and seeds. Suitable for pots or garden beds.

Chives

Hardy perennial herb with mild onion flavour. Produces edible purple flowers.

Red Basil

Aromatic herb with deep purple leaves. Strong flavour, ideal for salads and garnishes.

Flowers - Annuals

Nicotiana – Sensation Mix

Tall border plants, with an evening fragrance. Half-hardy annual with 60–90cm tall, branching stems and tubular, star-shaped flowers in shades of purple, red, pink, lime, and white.

Nicotiana – Evening Fragrant

Tall plants with tubular flowers releasing strong scent in the evening.

Nicotiana Eau De Cologne Mixed

A special mixture offering uniform, mid-height plants with upward-facing flowers, in a tapestry of glowing colours.

Gazania – Talent Mix

Sun loving, forming neat clumps of decorative silver-grey leaves, topped with large jewel bright, sun loving blooms. Perfect for containers and difficult dry and hot spots.

Gazania Tiger Stripes Mixed

These undemanding and free-flowering bedding plants tolerate drought or windy coastal sites with ease.

Scabiosa atropurpurea – Black Knight

A short-lived, clump-forming herbaceous perennial with feathery divided mid-green leaves. Throughout summer and early autumn it produces pincushion-shaped darkest burgundy, with almost black centres and white stamens, flowers that rise on tall stems above the foliage.

Scabiosa atropurpurea “Summer Fruits”

A bright cheerful mix in warm fruit shades, with large blooms on long stems, bee friendly.

Cosmos – Sensation Pinkie

Hardy annual, featuring large, purplish-pink flowers with yellow centres on 90 – 120cm, bushy plants. Ideal for borders and cut flowers, they bloom from June to October, thrive in full sun, and attract pollinators.

Cosmos – bipinnatus “Purity”

Hardy annual, an old variety with single snow white flowers and a gold centre, good for cutting as well as beds grows to 90 cm, and bee friendly.

Cosmos – bipinnatus “Rubenza”

Hardy annual, exceptionally coloured early variety blooms of very rich dark ruby which fades to antique rose as they age. Compact variety, bee friendly.

Cosmos – Sea Shells

Unique tubular petals in soft pastel shades. Light, airy plants attractive to pollinators.

Antirrhinum majus “Appleblossom”

Half Hardy Annual – spikes of lovely delicate blossoms in a range of shades from white to pink to blush pink and salmon with darker gentle soft pink markings on the throat – 90cm.

Phlox drummondii grandiflora “cherry caramel”

Hardy /Half Hardy Annual unusual flowers in antique caramel and rose-pink blooms, with bold darker pinky-red central stars. Very long flowering season and of course, perfect for cutting. Winner of a Fleuroselect Award. 2ft (60cm).

Cerithe major var. purpurascens Honeywort

An annual It has rather fleshy, blue-green leaves that, as they work their way up the stems, feel they should perhaps be rendering assistance in the bee-attraction department and change gradually to purple. And then you have the flowers - quite different from anything else you'll have in your garden, tubular and dark purple blue in colour, and will gain the attention of any visitor and quite a border-filling spread. 2ft (60cm)

Flowers – Annuals

Setaria Italica red jewel Foxtail millet

A splendid and robust ornamental grass with dense, nodding flower-heads up to 12ins long. All the varieties we list are excellent and unusual accompaniments for cut flowers, 3 ft (90cm) good for drying and leaving for the birds in winter.

Dahlia – Mignon

Dwarf bedding dahlia with single flowers in mixed colours. Ideal for borders and containers.

Zinnia – Jazz

Bright, semi-double blooms in mixed colours. Compact plants ideal for bedding.

Morning Glory – Heavenly Blue

Fast-growing climber with large sky-blue flowers. Best in a sunny, sheltered spot.

Nasturtium – Compact

Low-growing plants with bright flowers and edible leaves. Ideal for borders and pots.

Black-eyed Susan (Thunbergia)

Climbing orange/ yellow flowering plant.

Verbena Quartz Mixed

Early flowering, brightly coloured verbena with excellent mildew resistance.

Busy Lizzie Pearl Island

Bears long-lasting, shimmering blooms in pink, orange and white.

Petunia Double Orchid Flower Mixed

Producing masses of lavish double blooms with crisp, white picotee edges.

Petunia Frenzy Mixed

Over 20 different types of petunia flowers in pure colours, picotees, veined, and some with bright, white stars.

Rudbeckia All Sorts Mixed

All your favourite Rudbeckias in one spectacular mix.

Begonia Giant Lotto Mixed

Exceptionally large flowered variety compared to normal Begonia semperflorens cultivars.

Lobelia Ultra Cascade

A mix of old varieties and new varieties for a full summer of colour.

Geranium Jackpot Mixed

Masses of colourful single blooms on neat compact plants.

Foxgloves - 'Digitalis purpurea'

Biennial foxgloves grow up to 2 metres in height. Wonderful for pollinators. Best in dappled shade. Flowers late spring and summer. Will self seed.

Hollyhocks

Assorted colours. Short lived perennials. Grown from local seed. Plant in a sheltered sunny spot. Flowers from summer to autumn. Thrives in poor soil. Great for pollinators.

Geranium - Pink Cranesbill

Pretty pink deciduous perennial cranesbill. Grows in sun or shade. Flowers late spring to early summer. Loved by pollinators. Clump forming

Grasses

Arundo donax - 'Variegata'

Elegant variegated perennial grass. Height up to 1 metre. Perfect in borders or pots. Tends to spread well.

Sweet Peas

Sweet Pea – Fragrant

Highly scented mix with colourful blooms. Ideal for cutting.

Sweet Pea – Showbench

Large, exhibition-quality flowers on long stems. Strong scent.

Sweet Pea – Cupani

Historic heirloom with deep purple and blue flowers. Very fragrant.

Sweet Pea – Albert Blue

Soft blue flowers with classic sweet pea fragrance.

Sweet Pea – Theresa Maureen

Elegant pale pink blooms with strong scent. Good for cutting.

Sweet Pea – Amethyst & Orchids

Rich purple and mauve tones with strong fragrance.

Sweet Peas Lathyrus Odoratus – mixed

A mix of strongly scented sweet peas.

Flowers - Perennial

Lobelia – Queen Victoria

Tall spikes of deep maroon foliage topped by glowing scarlet blooms. Perfect for the edges of water features. bring a welcome splash of late summer colour.

Digitalis – Dalmatian Mix

Magnificent in cottage gardens and woodland borders, Nectar rich flowers are attractive to wildlife.

Achillea – Cerise Queen

Bright cerise pink flowers are produced on tall stems above the aromatic, feathery foliage. Creates an explosion of late summer colour. Easy to grow, even on poor dry soils, ideal for wildlife gardens where it attracts butterflies and other insects.

Delphinium – Dark Blue + White Bee

Tall enough to create vertical structure without demanding heavy staking. The flowers are densely packed on thick flower spikes and their rich blue colouring with a contrasting white eye.

Coreopsis – Golden Joy

Known for their reliability and their colourful, long-blooming flowers. They are easy to grow, low maintenance and will grow in most soil types. A compact, mounding type. Choose a sunny spot with well-drained soil.

Geum – Mrs Bradshaw

Flame-red, semi-double blooms on thin wiry stems. This compact, hardy perennial is easy to grow and provides long-lasting summer colour at the front of borders.

Verbena – Buenos Aires

Tightly clustered, rich purple florets which sit atop long stalks. The long lasting blooms of the stunning variety attract bees and butterflies.

Leucanthemum – Crazy Daisy

Wonderfully frilly, white, daisy-like blooms with soft buttery yellow centres that perch on upright stems. A magnet for bees, butterflies and other pollinating insects.

Dianthus – Rocking Red

Ruby red with a deeper red eye-ring. Produces an astounding quantity of flowers in late spring and then sporadically throughout the summer.

Aquilegia – Mrs Scott Elliott

A range of pretty colours are carried delicately on tall wiry stems. These will quickly naturalise to form a crowd of spring blooms

Japanese Anemone

Three popular pink / white varieties. A must-have for perennial borders and cottage gardens. Low maintenance and adored by pollinating insects.

Iris Jane Phillips

Pale blue scented flowers. Irises strongly prefer full sun—at least 6–8 hours daily—to bloom well. While they can tolerate partial shade, too little light leads to poor flowering.

Houseplants

Jade Plant (Crassula)

Succulent house plant. Easy care and tolerant of low light.

Christmas Cactus

Winter-flowering succulent with bright blooms. Prefers indirect light.

Dracaena

Architectural plant with long, striped leaves. Low maintenance and drought tolerant.

Aloe Vera

Succulent with fleshy leaves containing soothing gel. Requires bright light.

Monstera (only 1)

Large-leaved plant with natural splits. Thrives in bright, indirect light.

Pilea (Chinese Money Plant)

Compact plant with round leaves. Easy to propagate.

Spider Plant

Arching leaves with baby plantlets. Very easy and adaptable.
